But the history of hymns predates the 19th-Century Father Faber by at least two thousand years. The word "hymn" comes from the Greek "hymnos" and this gives some indication as to the age of hymnody. They were originally songs written in honour of the Gods, leading figures and heroes.

Knapp was the composer of more than five hundred gospel hymns and tunes. Fanny Crosby (1820-1915), blind at the age of six weeks, was a lifelong Methodist who began composing hymns at age six. She became a student at the New York Institute of the Blind at age 15 and joined the faculty of the Institute at 22, teaching rhetoric and history.
